Statewide Contest

• Grades K through 12 are eligible and Special Purpose Categories K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, 10-12, Special Purpose

Theme announced by NACD and posted on KACD website.

• Districts judge their own Posters and may submit electronically their First Place Winners for each category to the state contest

POSTER RULES

The theme for 2024 is "MAY THE FOREST BE WITH YOU ALWAYS" and must be on the poster. This is the only title theme eligible for the 2024 poster contest.

*No identification is to be on the front of the poster

*Horizontal orientation only

*May be computer generated and may be in pencil, pen and ink, paint, watercolor, crayon, cut paper, etc.

POSTERS - State Contest

• Judging is done by a specified District on a rotating basis.

• The specified District will judge the Posters and award First, Second, Third and 5 Honorable Mention Prizes for each category.

• State poster contest First Place Winners in each category are eligible for National Contest

NO EARLIER THAN SEPTEMBER I AND NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 19 OF EACH YEAR, electronic entries should be sent to the email below.

Only electronic submissions are accepted as either photos or scanned copies of the original posters.

The entries from each district must be entered in the State Poster Awards Program by the Conservation District board of supervisors. For identification, an entry form with information containing the participant's name, age, learning level, home address, telephone and/or email, and the conservation district must be entered with each poster.

Poster file must be submitted using this file name:

County_Gradelevel_Lastname of poster artist

Each poster entry form must be submitted using this file name:

County_Gradelevel_Lastname of poster artist_entry

LIMERICKS

Statewide Contest

Grades 5 through 8 and special schools are eligible

 Subject matter must be related to the use and/or conservation of natural resources.

 Districts judge their own Limericks and may submit electronically their First and Second Place Winners to the state contest

What Is A Limerick?

- The basic unit(foot) contains three syllables with a heavy accent on the third syllable: (ta ta TUM)
- Three such units (nine syllables) are in the 1st, 2nd and 5th lines, and these lines rhyme
- Two such units (six syllables) are in the 3rd and 4th lines, and these line rhyme
- Limericks are often humorous and nonsensical

Limerick Example

There was a young lady of station

"I love Man" was her exclamation

When men cried, "You flatter"

She replied, "No matter!

Isle of Man -- the true explanation.

Adapted from a limerick by Lewis Carroll

Limerick Rules

Limerick must have a title

Horizontal Display Only

Only electronic submissions, either photos or scanned copies, of the original creations are accepted as JPEG or TIFF files.

The entries from each district must be entered in the State Limerick Awards Program by the Conservation District board of supervisors. For identification, an entry form with information containing the participant's name, age, learning level, home address, telephone and/or email, and the conservation district must be submitted. (Special purpose students need not list age or level). No identification is to be on the front of the limerick. (We are asking that each conservation district type the name of each entry for correct spelling and readability). Please use the entry form provided or one like it.

Limerick file must be submitted using this file name:

County_Gradelevel_Lastname of limerick author

Each limerick entry form must be submitted using this file name:

County_Gradelevel_Lastname of limerick author_entry

ESSAY

- Statewide Contest.
- Two Essays from each county are eligible.
- Grades 5 through 8 and Special Schools are eligible.
- No specific topic is required (other than conservation), but each District is encouraged to select a topic for their contest.

Essay Rules

Letter Size Paper (8 ½" x 11")

500 Words or less, Double spaced

District Employees may type a copy <u>exactly as an entry is written</u> for students without access to a computer

For students participating from Junior High Schools that are members of the KSHSAA, the essay must be written under supervision of a teacher or other adult.

NO EARLIER THAN SEPTEMBER I AND NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 19 OF EACH YEAR, electronic entries should be sent to the email indicated below.

Only electronic submissions are accepted as .pdf files.

The entries from each district must be entered in the State Essay Awards Program by the Conservation District board of supervisors. For identification, an entry form with information containing the participant's name, age, learning level, home address, telephone and/or email, and the conservation district must also be submitted. (Special purpose students need not list age or level). No identification is to be on the front of the essay. (We are asking that each conservation district type the name of each entry for correct spelling and readability).

Please use the entry form provided or one like it.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES

Refer to contest rules and resources on the KACD Website https://kacdnet.org/

- Statewide Contest
- Youth aged 18 or younger as of December 1st can compete. Entrants may compete in the contest conducted by the conservation district in which they reside, or in the conservation district where they physically attend school.
- Theme: Conservation Practices
- Photo must be taken 10/01 9/30 of the current year
- Minor digital enhancements for cropping, red-eye remove, filters and corrective functions are permitted
- Districts may submit electronically one photo to the state contest

NO EARLIER THAN SEPTEMBER I AND NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 19 OF EACHYEAR, photo file and the KACD photo contest entry/release file should be sent to the email indicated below.

Only an electronic submission, either a picture or a scanned copy, of the original photo is acceptable as a JPEG or TIFF file.

The photo file name must follow this format.

County_Lastname of photographer

The photo contest entry/release form file name:

County_Lastname of photographer_entry form

EXAMPLE:

Peter Cadbury in 6th grade has taken which has won first place in the Neosho County Conservation District Conservation Photo Contest. The District Manager will submit the photo to <u>pamela.walker@ks.nacdnet.net</u> as a jpg or .tiff file with the file name of Neosho_Cadbury. His entry form/photo release file will be named Neosho_Cadbury_entry form, and it will be submitted with the photo file.

In submitting photo, the photographer gives KACD Education and Youth Committee permission to use their photo in any publications, social media, websites, displays and other places without payment or other consideration.

The photo release is part of the entry form and must be completed and submitted.

Photo Judging

Photos will be judged on technical merit, composition and eye appeal.

For technical merit, judges may check to see if the photo is well-framed, properly exposed, sharp and clear.

For composition, judges determine if the photo features a recognizable center of interest, action and imagination and creativity.

Speech Contest Levels

- O District, Area and State Speech Contests will all be subject to the same procedural rules so that all participants are competing within a uniform process.
- District and Area Contests may develop their own methods for locations, judges, prizes and awards, etc.
- Area winners must be provided to the Conservation Education and Youth Committee **no later** than Friday of the first full week of November (earlier preferred)
 - District Winners must compete in their Area Contest, and Area
 Winners must compete in the State Contest.

Speech Contest Rules

• All High School students in grade levels 9-12 who reside in the State of Kansas are eligible to participate in the Speech Contests.

 Speeches must be at least five minutes long, but not longer than eight minutes and penalties will be assessed for any violations.


 Contestants will present their speeches as determined by drawing numbers for the order, and contestants will remain outside the room until their turn to speak.

Speech Contest Rules

- Contestants may utilize 3' x 5' note cards, however if the use of the cards detracts from the effectiveness of the presentation, a penalty may be assessed.
- Speeches will be judged on Content, Organization of Material,
 Voice, Stage Presence, Power of Expression, and General
 Effect.

Speech Contest Rules, Continued

- A supporting document that is directly related to the topic of the speech must be provided to the panel of judges.
- A brief bibliography must accompany the supporting document, and direct quotes from any source must be identified in the bibliography.
- All previous First Place State Contest winners are ineligible.





State Speech Contest Scholarship Awards:

\$1,000 for First Place \$500 for Second Place \$250 for Honorable Mention

- ✓ Payment will be made upon proof of enrollment at an accredited school or training institution of the winner's choice.
- ✓ Scholarships must be claimed within four years of graduation from high school.
- ✓ The KACD Auxiliary may provide additional monies for expenses.

Scholarships

The Caroline & Don Peterson Memorial Scholarship

- Funded by Peterson Family
- Up to \$1000 for the fall semester for a full-time **college** Junior or Senior student majoring in Agronomy/Range Management
- Selection Criteria includes Academic Performance, Leadership, Conservation Promotion, Work Experience and the Quality of the Application

Scholarships

General

- Funded by the Conservation Education and Youth Committee
- Up to \$1000 for the fall semester for a full-time college junior or senior student majoring in Agriculture or a Natural Resource related course
- Selection Criteria includes Academic Performance,
 Leadership, Conservation Promotion, Work Experience and the Quality of the Application

Scholarships

Memorial Scholarship
